Kati Angarone has worked at the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) for more than 20 years and currently serves at the Associate Commissioner for Science and Policy. In this role she works to develop policy that is protective of New Jersey's environment and public health and to ensure policy cohesion across the Department in furtherance of the Department priorities (e.g. Climate, Water and Public Health). The Office of Science & Policy includes, Division of Science & Research, which provides scientific support to programs across the Department, as well as other State agencies; and the Office of Environmental Public Health & Safety, which work closely with the New Jersey Department of Health to provide analysis and data for environmental public health issues.

Prior to assuming the role of Associate Commissioner, Kati spent many years assisting with the development of New Jersey's state land use policies including stormwater management, habitat protection, flood hazard area controls and protection of the Highlands region. She also spent several years at the Department focused on drinking water policy, including the adoption of new drinking water standards, prevention and management of harmful algal blooms and water supply emergency response.
